Second installment of INA police video investigative series available tomorrow!

n November, the Iowa Newspaper Association launched a statewide project focused on police video rules, regulations and associated policies. Since the launch of the project, numerous journalists from across the state have requested copies of these policies from local police departments, sheriff departments and other law enforcement agencies.

This multi-part series of investigative articles are being made available without charge to all INA members. This story, the second in the InFocus police video project, explores how Iowa law enforcement agencies balance accountability with privacy of people shown in police recordings. There are legitimate questions about how videos should be redacted to protect privacy, but there also are cases of law enforcement agencies using privacy as a red herring to keep videos secret.

The second installment is available to all INA members for download. **The story should be embargoed for print until April 25 and embargoed for digital until April 26.** We strongly encourage all newspapers to download and use the story, editoral, photos and sample page provided.

The Iowa Newspaper Foundation received more than 80 applications for the nine scholarships. These annual scholarships are one way the INF contributes to the education of young Iowans anticipating newspaper careers.

The Iowa Newspaper Foundation is grateful to the Woodward Foundation for its support of the Fred W.

Woodward Scholarship. The scholarship honors the late Fred W. Woodward, longtime publisher of the Dubuque Telegraph Herald, and is given to a student at a college or university in Iowa, Illinois, or Wisconsin.

The David W. Belin Scholarship is awarded to a student attending or planning to attend the Greenlee School of Journalism and Communication at Iowa State University and is in conjunction with the Iowa Journalism Institute awards, which are funded through a gift to the Iowa Newspaper Foundation given by Gary Gerlach and Michael Gartner. The late David W. Belin was a nationally recognized lawyer and longtime business partner of Gerlach and Gartner.

Two scholarships are given in memory of Carter Pitts, longtime publisher of the Le Mars Daily Sentinel and the first president of the Iowa Newspaper Foundation. The Carter Pitts/Le Mars Daily Sentinel Scholarship is funded by an annual gift from the Daily Sentinel. The Carter Pitts Scholarship Endowment Award was set up through a gift established by members of the Pitts family.

The Morlan Scholarship is given in memory of Frank Morlan, a longtime Iowa newspaper owner. The student awarded will be enrolling in a two-year or fouryear journalism program at an Iowa institution of higher learning or is currently enrolled at an Iowa institution of higher learning.

The Iowa Newspaper Foundation scholarship is provided through contributions from Iowa newspapers and the Pages for the 21st Century program.

The Iowa College Media Association (ICMA) Scholarship is offered to a student attending a college or university with a membership in ICMA.

The Robert K. and Evelyn M. Reiste Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a student focusing on journalism with a community newspaper or familyowned business interest.

The INF will offer scholarships for students again next year. Online application will be available to all public and private high schools in Iowa as well as college and university journalism and mass communication departments.
